# Planning for Summer vs. Planning for Retirement

**I** have heard it said many times that some people plan more for their summer vacation than their retirement. It makes sense; people are more motivated to plan a holiday that is fun and will happen soon versus planning something necessary and further out.

# Change

**D**ear Friends:  
Christ is Among Us!  
As I begin writing this article, let me go back to Easter Sunday – Pascha 2025. The entire world was delighted to see Pope Francis on the balcony of St. Peter’s Basilica. He was able to pray with the faithful, offer his “Urbi et Orbi” message to the world, and even drove around greeting the faithful gathered in St. Peter’s Square. On the next day we learned that Pope Francis had died, he returned to the house of the Father. I was in shock.

From that moment on, the eyes of the entire world were on the Vatican. Hundreds of thousands of people, Catholic and non-Catholic, traveled to Rome to bid farewell to the “Pope of the peripheries,” a leader who spoke and acted on behalf of marginalized groups of people worldwide. I have to be honest that I did not always agree with Pope Francis (and he was my boss), but I did admire his ability to connect with people from all walks of life, his humility, concern for the poor, and emphasis on God’s mercy.

Afterwards, we began praying for the conclave. The media was having a heyday, chasing the cardinals around St. Peter’s Square, presenting to us the top “contenders”, and once again they were wrong! I even had someone tell me

that they wanted cardinal Pizzaballa to be the next pope. When I asked why? Because they liked his last name Pizzaballa – Dancing Pizza! Instead, we were all shocked when Pope Leo XIV stepped out onto the balcony of St. Peter’s to bless the world. I could not believe it! The first American Pope! Let us pray for our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV as he begins his pontificate. May he, as successor to the Apostle Peter, build the Church into a sacrament of unity, love, and peace for all the world.

**It is important for ALL of us to entrust God with our changes.**

With this “change” in the life of the Church we often wonder, what will happen next? We don’t like change because sometimes it can be very hard. As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday – the Descent of the Holy Spirit we see how the lives of the apostles, simple men, changed for good. A simple fisherman Peter became the first Pope of Rome. A man who became known as doubting Thomas, becomes the founder of Christian communities in India. I’m sure cardinal Robert Prevost from Chicago was not ready for that major change in his life!

Changes are difficult and learning to cope with change is a large part of our maturing process – the older you get, the more changes there are. And let’s be honest some changes are for the good; others are not so good. The big question is how do you react to change, that is, are you able to successfully cope/deal with change in life?

I remember when our daughters were changing schools. This change was for their good, but with this change our daughters were facing new challenges: new friends, new teachers, new bus drivers, etc. Two of our daughters were okay with this change, one had a harder time coping with this change.

As a parent, priest, spiritual advisor of the GCU, I must say that it is important for ALL of us to entrust God with our changes.

Facing changes in life there will always be fear,

anxiety and stress. But for us there is always that avenue of prayer that brings us into the presence and protection of almighty God. The phrase “The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?” from Psalm 27, can be very helpful to us since it emphasizes God’s strength and protection. This verse reassures us that we can trust in God, especially in times of fear, anxiety and stress that comes with changes in life. When you find yourself in the eye of a storm, don’t forget that changes in life don’t confuse God or make any more difficult for Him to care for you. God is with Us – S nami Boh, as we sing in our Churches!

To wrap it up, after the “changes” we have witnessed in the life of the Church, please do not resign to changes. Do not allow that passive/aggressive approach to change.

Accept the fact that changes in life are natural and inevitable. When you get “hit” by an unexpected change, try to keep that proper perspective, and ALWAYS put your trust in God.

A small group of Byzantine Catholics in 1892 gathered in Wilkes-Barre, PA, to bring a change into peoples lives. This legacy continues on in the GCU especially with our programs that emphasize giving back to the places where we live, work and worship. Bringing positive – holy change into people’s lives.

When it happens to you or me, remember to cope with change with faith, trust and hope. This will allow your relationship with God to grow stronger and transform us into the people He wants us to be.

# Lessons in the Law

## RMD-What Is This? Part Three

**T**wo previous articles dealt with defining RMDs, what it is, and how to lower the tax.

It is never too late to strategize a plan for your RMDs for this year and for the years in the future. Remember, there are lots of exceptions, there are different rules for different accounts,

but the bottom line is that the IRS wants your tax money.

What can you do?

- The IRS wants you to take the minimum distribution each year because the IRS is guaranteed more taxes over time.
- RMD is the minimum amount that you must take out yearly. But one should know what tax rate you are in and maybe you can withdraw more than the RMD and still pay taxes in a lower bracket.
- Try not to take two years of RMD in the same year. You could pay substantially more in taxes and you might have to pay higher Medicare premiums.
- If you are the right age, you can withdraw funds from your IRA and pay taxes on the withdrawal which lowers the future RMD amounts.

- Make a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) directly from your IRA account to a charity. If you are Age 70½ or older, you get a qualified charitable deduction. If you are Age 73 or older, the QCD will count toward your RMD. No charitable deduction, but no tax on this money. A donation to the GCU Foundation qualifies.
- Take your RMD or RMD & more and roll that money over into a GCU fixed or deferred annuity. It may not save taxes on the distribution, but this is a great way to make more money not be subject to RMD rules.
- Take your RMD or RMD & more and purchase a GCU single premium life insurance policy. What a great way to use this money to buy insurance that pays out tax free to your beneficiaries.

This is not an all-exclusive list but it shows we need to take an aggressive attitude to these distributions. For more information you can contact the GCU Sales Department at 1-800-722-4428.

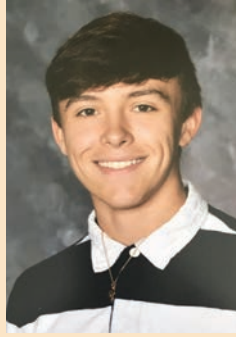

Margaret excelled in track, soccer and basketball. Her high school's basketball team finished as District Champions in 2022 & 2024. She was also an avid volunteer for

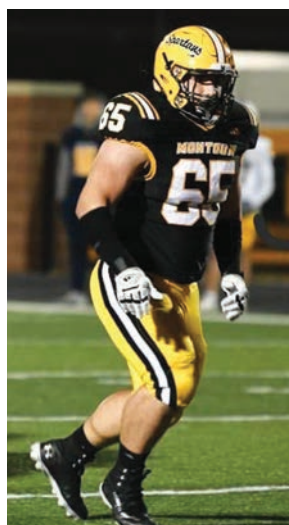
